Scholarship deadline is December 15.

Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 20 ACT and 3.5 overall GPA or 24 ACT and 3.0 GPA. To be considered for UAB academic scholarships, you must be admitted by December 1 of your senior year. A December ACT score will be considered for scholarship purposes if the student is already admitted and requests UAB to pull his or her score. Honors College admission offered to students who meet criteria: 28 ACT and 3.5 or higher GPA. Honors College Specialized Program application deadline is January 15.

Admission application opens on September 1. Applicants are reviewed on an individual basis. The average GPA for entering freshmen in 2016 was 3.83; the middle 50% ACT range was 24-30. Algebra II is required. Writing portion of ACT is no longer required. Minimums for automatic scholarships are 28 ACT (or comparable SAT) and 3.5 GPA. December 1 is the priority deadline for the merit-based or academic scholarships. February 10 is the deadline to receive final consideration for available Freshman Scholarships, as well as General Scholarships awarded by the Office of University Scholarships and Departmental Scholarships awarded by Auburn's colleges and schools. March 1 is the FAFSA deadline for consideration of financial aid. May 1 is the deadline to accept or decline scholarship offers.

A student will be conditionally admitted with a 16 ACT and a 2.0 GPA with at least 11 core units (4 English, 2 Math, 2 Natural or Physical Science, 3 Social Studies). The University has also updated the Vanguard and Academic Scholarship grid for the class of 2017. Other Excellence Scholarships (Leadership and PMA) will be stackable up to \$10,000 per year. Algebra II and foreign language are not required. Minimums to qualify for ACADEMIC scholarships are 20 ACT and 3.5 GPA. Scholarship deadline is December 15, 2016, after which awards are based on fund availability.

The application committee values test scores and GPA, but takes a holistic view in considering a student for admission and scholarships. Recommended 20 ACT or 930 SAT and 3.0 GPA. Average of last year's incoming class was between a 22-27 ACT and a 3.4 GPA. If you have below a 20 ACT, then Spring Hill will look closely at your GPA and rigor of high school courses for possible admission. Algebra II is required for admission. Foreign Language is not required. Minimums to quality for scholarships are 20 ACT and 2.5 GPA.

The last ACT test date considered for Leadership scholarship is December, and February for Chancellor's and Millennium.

(SAT: 950 or above—unconditional acceptance; 870-940—conditional acceptance.) Algebra II not required for admission, but recommended. Foreign Language not required. Scholarship deadline is March 1. (February is last ACT considered w/scores being sent directly to JSU.) Minimum scores to qualify for scholarships are 22 ACT for automatic scholarships, and 20 ACT and 2.5 GPA for Leadership Scholarships. Students must apply for admission and be accepted before applying for scholarships or housing.
